**Geography** will be a combination of river work and comparisons between the United Kingdom and North America.


## PE REMINDER

## WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS TERM

### ENGLISH

In English, we will continue to develop our different writing skills, focussing on grammar and punctuation. We will be writing non-chronological reports, diary entries, formal and informal letter writing. Spellings will be worked upon within school and the children will also have their weekly reading challenges to complete at home.

### MATHS

Daily Maths lessons will take place in the morning and continue to build on the children's previous knowledge. We will be covering decimals and percentages, properties of shapes, conversion of units and volume. The children will also continue with their daily arithmetic. As always there will still be a focus on times tables.

### SCIENCE

In Science our topic will be 'Animals including Humans'. This will include observing life-cycle changes and looking at the work of David Attenborough. In addition to this the children will be studying the changes as humans develop into old age. We will also be covering changes to our own bodies including puberty.
